

# EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN COURSE

Dear Prospective EMT Student -

Thank you for your interest in the EMT Course. The intention of the Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) certification program is to train an individual to function independently in a medical emergency. The course provides the basic knowledge and skills needed to deliver Basic Life Support (BLS) care and is required to progress to more advanced levels of prehospital patient care.

The course requires a minimum of 154 hours of classroom and skills instruction and approximately 24+ hours of Clinical/Field rotations. For these rotations, you will need to ride an **ambulance** to obtain ten (10) patient contacts. This course is setup to train individuals to serve as a vital link in the chain of the health care team. This includes all skills necessary to provide emergency medical care as an attendant-in-charge (AIC) on a BLS ambulance.

Eligibility to attend an Emergency Medical Technician course in Virginia requires that you must:

- (1) Be proficient in reading, writing and speaking the English language.
- (2) Be a minimum of 16 years of age at the beginning date of the certification course. If less than 18 years of age, you must provide the course coordinator with a completed parental permission form with the signature of a parent or guardian verifying approval for enrollment in the course.
- (3) Have no physical or mental impairment that would render them unable to perform all cognitive and psychomotor skills required for that level of certification.
- (4) Hold current certification in an Office of Emergency Medical Services approved Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) course at the beginning date of the course. This certification must also be current at the time of state testing.

The majority of the classes will be at the Shannon Training Center located at 8711 Courthouse Road in Spotsylvania County. Classes take place on Mondays, Wednesdays and some Saturdays (the schedule is below). Topic schedule may change, but the dates will remain. The start times is 6:30pm.

We will offer two CPR Courses: Saturday 25MAR23 or Saturday 08APR23 -0900 until complete. If you are unable to attend our dates, you can take a course from another source, but must bring a valid card the first night of class 17APR23

The current CPR courses, which are acceptable by the Virginia Office of EMS to meet the standard, are:

- American Heart Association Basic Cardiac Life Support "Healthcare Provider"
- American Red Cross "CPR/AED for the Professional Rescuer and Healthcare Provider" or CPR/AED for Lifeguards
- American Safety and Health Institute "CPR-PRO"
- Emergency Care and Safety Institute "Professional Rescuer" / "Healthcare Provider CPR & AED" EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN COURSE
- EMS Safety Services, Inc. CPR/AED for Professional Rescuers (2/1/2014)
- Medic First Aid BLS for Professionals "BLSPRO"
- National Safety Council "Healthcare and Professional Rescuer"
- ProCPR "Healthcare Provider"

The cost for the course is \$400 is due in full on Monday 17APR23. This cost includes <u>electronic textbook</u>, CPR certification, student shirt, initial testing fees, blood pressure cuff and stethoscope. This fee will be due on the first night of EMT class. You will need to have access to a computer for this class and to access your textbook. Homework, quizzes and/or tests will require the use of a computer both inside and outside of class. You must have ample time to study and practice outside of class to be successful.

You are required to take pre-course exam and attend an informal interview. The informal interview (more of a meet and greet) will be setup after your pre-course exam. There are two days 23MAR23 and 08APR23 – both Saturdays. If you need CPR, you will take CPR class, then pre-course exam and then informal interview. If you only need the pre-course exam show up at 0900 you will take the exam and then the informal interview will be conducted post exam.

When we receive your application, we will send you a study guide for the pre-course exam. The exam should take approximately one hour; afterwards we will meet with you individually. If you do not receive an e-mail with the study guide, please contact me at <u>madisonkg@gmail.com</u>. If you are unavailable 25MAR23 or 08APR23 please let me know and we will **attempt** to accommodate.

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# **Class Rules**

- 1. No radios or cellular phones in class. All computers, laptops, and/or tablets should have the volume muted and only be used for class related purposes and not become a distraction.
- Students will dress appropriately for class, wearing clothing that allows the student to perform practical exercises while not being a distraction to fellow students. Uniform will be required – EMS pants/student shirt this will be discussed the first night of class and implemented 2 weeks post first day of class.
- 3. During lecture/field/clinical shifts, the student must wear the issued uniform, to include closed toe shoes, dark slacks (NO JEANS) and the issued uniform shirt will be worn at all times. While on a scene during field shifts, a reflective vest indicating the student's status is to be worn at all times.
- 4. No disruptive behavior will be allowed. If disruptive behavior continues, student will be recommended for additional disciplinary actions up to removal from the program.
- 5. All students will remain respectful of all students and instructors.
- 6. Active participation by all class members is expected in all aspects of lecture discussion and psychomotor sessions. Subject/Topic matter related questions are encouraged.
- 7. You are expected to arrive to class on time. Anyone arriving more than 20 minutes late is considered absent from class.

### \*\*\*\*\*Any Classes deviating from this standard will be indicated as such in the course schedule.

- 8. Missed classes (tardy and absences) may not exceed more than 10% in class course hours.
- 9. An overall 75% average and instructors' approval must be obtained in order to qualify to sit for the Certification Examination.
- 10. If a student receives a failing score on an exam, the student can have one attempt at retest the next class date at 1730 (m/w) or 0830 (s). If the re-test is failed then a remediation packet will be required to be completed to demonstrate a satisfactory understanding of the tested material. This remediation will only be offered twice. Should a third exam be double failed, the student will be recommended for removal from the program.
- 11. If a remediation packet is found to not demonstrate a satisfactory understanding of the material as decided by the reviewing panel, the student will be recommended for removal from the program.
- 12. Anyone who falsifies information or is found to be cheating will be immediately removed from the program.
- 13. All day classes will be held at Spotsylvania Volunteer Rescue Squad's Shannon Training Center unless otherwise specified.
